person who served with me in Co. B. 9th Regt. Inf.

under name James D. Brooks. There was

no other Brooks in my company. I did

not know this claimant prior to enlistment

I got acquainted with him as a member of

Co. B. 9th Regt. Inf.

I do not know of any disease or

debility with which this claimant

was affected in service. No sir I

have no recollection that he complained

of anything being the matter with him while

we were in the army together. I have seen him

pretty much every day since the war

I think I have at least seen him every

week. I know where he lives now but I

don't know where he has lived since the

war. It was at the Frederick wharf

that I have seen him. He has been generally

ever since the war been working around

that wharf and I have been working
