Brooks since the war I never saw him at all for ten years after the war and since then I have not seen much of him not enough to know his condition the last time I saw him he made complaint of something being the matter with him I think either blindness or deafness or something of that kind and I think also of some internal trouble but I forget the nature of it.

Q Have you any knowledge that claimant ever contracted sunstroke in service? A. Yes he did wear sunstroke in service. I don't remember when it was but it was in warm weather I was right in ranks drilling with him when he was sunstruck and saw him when he was overcome by the heat He had to leave the ranks and was taken to his quarters but I don't know who took him there.

Having had read to me the statements of claimant as to incurrence by him of rheumatism pain in left side shortness of breath, giddiness of head and disease of eyes, I will say I don't remember that he was affected with any of
