Harshbarger, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Arick Barclay, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: Age about 54, Occupation Farmer, P. O. Eden Md. and resides in T Mill.

I served as a private in Co. B. 9. U.S. Inf. for 3 years and I am now drawing a pension.

I never knew Brooks prior to my enlistment and have not seen him since my discharge.

I knew Brooks well in the Army but I can't remember that he had anything ailing him while in the Army. He was not wounded or injured to my recollection and he did not suffer with any disease that I can recall.

I can't remember that he had anything trouble or rheumatism, neither do I remember that he was ever struck or complained with disease of head or eyes. I don't know him to suffer with pain of his left side.
