On this 6th day of July, 1896, at
Near Fruitland, County of Wicomico
 State of Maryland, before me, W. H. Harshbarger, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

Benjamin Handy, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: Age about 49. Occupation
Former P. O. and Residence Fruitland
Md.

I was a private in Co. B. 9. 11th Regt.
 and was in the U.S. service a little
 over 3 years. I am drawing a pension.

I can remember that we had a
 man named James David Brooks
 in my company and that he
 was a Corporal. That is about
 all I remember about him, I don't
 remember of meeting or talking
 with him.

I did not know him before
 I met him in the army and
 I have not seen him since
 our discharge, and don't know where
 he is now.

I cannot remember that the
Alt. was disabled in any manner
 in the army. I think he was with
 us at our discharge, but I can't
 recall his condition.

No I do not know of him having
 been on the Alt. states at John's Island
S.C. or any other time in the U.S.
service. Can't recall of him being
 sunstruck or having any ^{thing} matter
