

Widow's Declaration for Pension or Increase of Pension.

State of Mass, County of Baltimore, ss: Jan

ON THIS 17 day of Oct A. D. one thousand eight hundred and 91

personally appeared before me Justin of the Peace a Court of Record within and for the County and State aforesaid Mary F Snowden

aged 48 years, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the Pension provided by Acts of Congress granting pension to widows: That she is the widow of John

Snowden, who under the name of John Snowden

at 21, on the 21 day of Oct A. D. 1863

in Co of 7 Mass Regt (Company and Regiment of service, if in the army; or vessel and rank, if in the navy.)

in the war of 1861-1865 who died from cancer (State nature of wounds and all circumstances attending them,

incurred in the service during of duty or the disease and manner in which it was incurred, in either case showing soldier's death to have been the sequence.)

on the 7 day of March A. D. 1879 who bore at the time of his death the rank of priv in Co of 7 Mass Regt ("In the service aforesaid," or otherwise.)

that she was married under the name of Mary F Bowen to said John Snowden

on the Jan day of Jan A. D. 1864 by Richard C. Med

at Baltimore there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that neither she nor her husband had been previously married (If either have been previously married

so state, and give date of death or divorce of former spouse.)

that she has to present date remained his widow; that the following are the names and dates of birth of all his legitimate children yet surviving who were under sixteen years of age at father's death, viz:

- John Snowden of soldier by John Snowden, born 6 Jan 1869
- James of soldier by John Snowden, born 30 Aug 1870
- Mary of soldier by John Snowden, born 15 Sep 1871
- Sudair of soldier by John Snowden, born 18 June 1873
- William of soldier by John Snowden, born 1 Jan 1877

That she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or maintenance.

(For such children as are not under her care claimant should account.)

that she has not in any manner engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States; that

prior application has been filed No 425-1124 (If prior application has been filed, either by soldier or widow, so state, giving number assigned to it.) File granted
