ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT.

Whereas I, May J. Snowden widow of John Snowden late a B in Co. 7 of the U.S. 67 Regiment of U.S. 67 Vols. war of 1861, having made application for Original pension under the laws of the United States:

Now this Agreement witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the services done and to be done in the premises, I hereby agree to allow my attorneys, MILO B. STEVENS & CO., WASHINGTON, D.C. the fee of Twenty-five Dollars, which shall include all amounts paid and to be paid for any services in the furtherance of said claim; and said fee shall not be demanded by or payable to my said attorneys, in whole or in part, except in case of the granting of my pension by the Commissioner of Pensions; and the same shall be paid to them in accordance with the provisions of Sections 4768 and 4769 of the Revised Statutes, U. S.
