Sir:

In response to your call of the 10th instant, received the 13th (G. S. K. 319, 445,935), relative to the case of Frances Jones, of 706 Cider Alley, Baltimore, Md., as widow of Charles H. Jones, late private, Co. F, 7th U. S. C. Vol. Inf., Wid. Ctf. No. 562,263, you are advised that a certified transcript from the death records of the city of Baltimore, Md., shows the death of Charles H. Jones, July 2, 1903; and a certified transcript from the marriage records of Kent Co., Md., shows the marriage of Charles H. Jones and Fannie Perkins, June 17, 1868.

Other evidence shows no prior marriage of either.

A report from the records of the War Department shows that Charles H. Jones was enrolled September 20, 1863, in Co. F, 7th U. S. C. Vol. Inf., and was mustered out with the company October 13, 1866. It does not appear that he was discharged for disability.
