SIR:

Your inquiry of November 16th, 1886, in Pension Claim No. 578,419, is herewith returned, with the following information:

Jeremiah Jobs was enrolled on the 31st day of March, 1864, at Baltimore Co. Md, as a private 1st in Co. K, 30th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years.

He is reported on Muster Roll from orgn. to April 30. 64 present for duty; May & June absent "Genl. Hospl. City Point, Va.;" July & Aug. 64 and to Oct. 31. 65 present for duty.

He was mustered out of service with company Dec. 10. 1865 at Roanoke Island, N. C. - a Corp. apptd. Oct 31. 65. He is borne on most rolls as Jeremiah Jobs.

Co. Returns covering March '64 to Nov. 65 (save April, 64) show him July, 64, sick in Hospl.

Records on file do not show disabilities or injury alleged, or furnish any additional information as to disability during service; nor do they show date he was sent to or returned from Genl. Hospl. or nature of sickness above reported.

Co. morning reports cover March, Apr. & May, 64 & Nov. 64 to Dec. 65. Regtl. Hospl. Records are not on file.
