In the above claim the applicant should state, under oath, the character, location, extent, and value of all property, real, personal, or mixed, owned or possessed by her, or in which she has any pecuniary interest, and the full amount of her income from all sources; or that she possesses no estate, should such be the fact; and if no person be legally bound to support the claimant, it should be so stated. Bonds, stocks, and investments should be noted in the affidavit of the applicant, likewise.

The claimant's affidavit should be accompanied by a duly verified statement from the proper records showing the description and assessed value of all taxable property borne on the rolls in the name of the applicant, and the true value of the same, where the assessment is upon a basis other than cash value, and the officer in charge of the records has knowledge of the approximately true value. Should no taxable property appear in her name, he should so state. Where such officer has an official seal, a transcript under his signature, authenticated by such seal, will be accepted. In all other cases, his statement should be to the best of his knowledge and belief, and under oath. If any property is incumbered by mortgage or otherwise, the applicant should file a duly authenticated transcript from the public records, showing the nature and location of the property charged, and the amount of the incumbrance.
