

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION

ACT OF MAY 1, 1920

State of Maryland, County of City of Baltimore, ss:

On this 11th day of November, 1929, before me, the undersigned personally appeared Mary G. Jobes, who makes the following declaration as an application for pension under the provisions of the act of Congress approved May 1, 1920, and for accrued pension.

That she is ^{suppose} 60 years of age, that she was born Was freed from slavery while a child at Queensanne's County, Maryland

That she is the widow of Jeremiah Jobes, who ENLISTED March 21, 1864, at Baltimore, Md., under the name of Jeremiah Jobes; in Co. K 30th, Regt. U. S. C. Inf. (Here state company and regiment, if in the Army; or vessel, if in the Navy)

and was honorably DISCHARGED December 10, 1865, having served ninety days or more, or was discharged for, or died in service of the United States of a disability incurred in the service in the line of duty, during the CIVIL WAR, and who DIED March 9, 1895, at Baltimore, Md.

That he also served in No other service (Here give a complete statement of all other military or naval service, if any, at whatever time rendered)

and that, except as herein stated, said soldier (or sailor) was not employed in the military or naval service of the United States; License issued

THAT SHE WAS MARRIED to said soldier (or sailor) May 16, 1877, under the name of Mary G. Martin, at Baltimore, Md. by Rev. Landis; that she had not been previously married, that he had (or not) been previously married; (or not)

He lived with a certain Mary Jobes, to whom he was not legally If there was a prior marriage of either, the name and the date and place of death or divorce of the former consort, or consorts, should be stated married, and who died about 1904.

That neither she nor said soldier was ever married otherwise than as stated above.

That she was NOT divorced from the soldier (sailor or marine); and that she has NOT remarried since his death.

That the following are the ONLY children OF THE SOLDIER (sailor or marine) who are now living and are under sixteen years of age.

(If he left no children under sixteen years of age, the claimant should so state)

No children

That she did not serve in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States between April 6, 1917, and July 2, 1921, or at any time during said period. (did or did not)

That no member of her family served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States between April 6, 1917, and July 2, 1921, or at any time during said period. (a or no)

(If any members of claimant's family were in the military or naval service during the period mentioned, state the full name under which each such member served, with the designation of the organization in (or vessel on) which such service was rendered, together with the dates of enlistment and discharge. State also whether any such members are dead; and, if so, give the names.)

That she has heretofore applied for pension, the number of her former claim being 617,413; that said soldier (sailor or marine) was a pensioner, the number of his pension certificate being Unknown

Applicant claims the benefits of the Act of July 3, 1926, if entitled.

That she hereby appoints with full power of substitution and revocation.

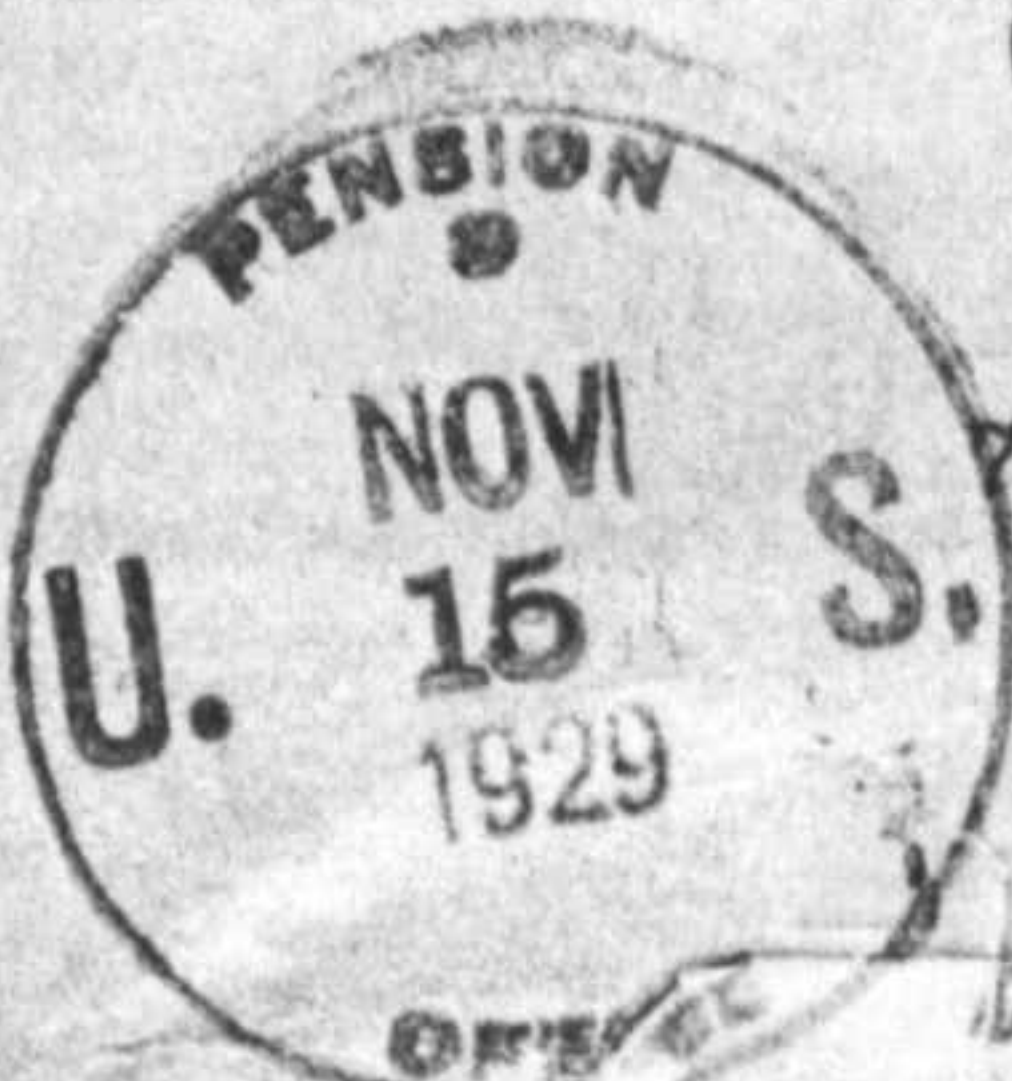
