We are anxious to get some information about the claim of a colored woman - Mary G. Jobes - widow of Jeremiah Jobes - who died in 1895, while he was receiving a Civil War pension.

Mary applied for the pension to be given her some years ago, and has a card from the Bureau of Pensions stating that her application was received on November 8, 1912, and was numbered 617413. Another number given at the bottom of the card is W 6476369. Mary says that she has evidence to prove that she was the legal wife of Jeremiah, and should be receiving her husband's pension.

Can you give us any information about this? If this is not the Department handling such cases, please let us know where we should apply for information.

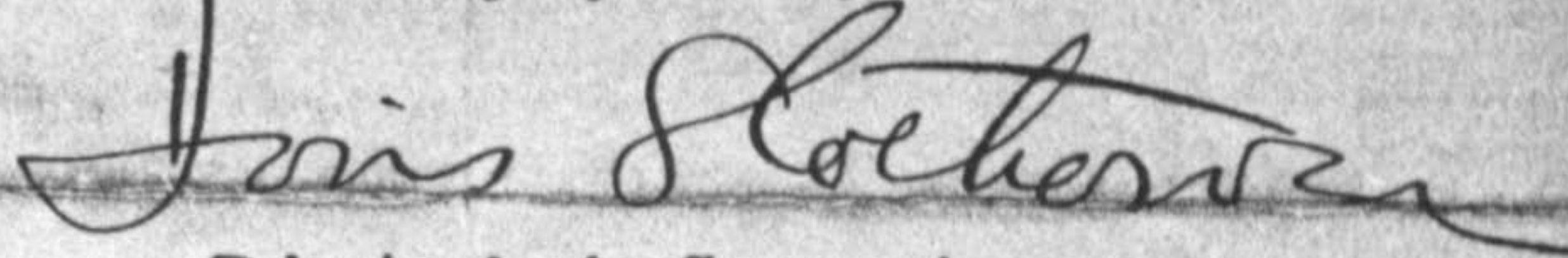
