Baltimore, County of Calvert,  
 State of Md, before me, Geo. A. Ritchfield, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

Mary G. Jones, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: In addition and

supplementary to the statement  
 I made to you on Oct. 11, 1895-

I will say in reply to your  
 further questions that my p.o.  
 address is still 1317 Bayard St.  
 Baltimore Md. and that I am the identical  
 Mary G. Jones who has made appli-  
 cation for pension as the widow  
 of Jeremiah Jones who served  
 during the late war in Co. K, 35th Inf.  
 My claim is numbered 617,413.

I have my marriage certificate  
 of marriage to Jeremiah Jones which  
 I now show you from which it appears  
 I was married to said Jeremiah  
 Jones on May 16, 1874 here in Baltimore  
 Md. by Rev. Landis - Maria Bailey  
642 N. Montgomery was present and  
 saw us married as did also Fannie  
Carroll.

I know it is said that my said  
 husband was married here in Baltimore  
 Md to a woman named Mary but I  
 don't know what her other name was.  
 My husband was not a slave  
 and neither was his first wife  
 They were married a short time
