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here two months. A young man next door recommended him. No other lodger has been in this house, except once a man and wife. I have not remarried since Mr. Jones' death, nor have I lived with any man as a wife. I have not had a child, never had but one child in my life.

This lodger is not a friend of mine nor of Mrs. Lindsay's. He is about 30 or 35 years old. I know but little about him. He is nothing but a lodger for which he pays a dollar a week. He gets his meals elsewhere.

The cause of my separation from my husband was because he was intimate with Laura Davis who occupied part of the house where we resided, and she had a child to him. She is dead. I remained in Baltimore and worked out at service and daisy work, and later went to New Orleans and became a servant in a family for two or three years, and I met Sandy Shelton in that city. We were not married, but lived together about two years and I left him, I got tired and knew it wasn't right and I returned to Baltimore. I did not marry to any one, nor did I live with any man after I left
