

DEPOSITION ECase of Sophia Queen, No. 417.141

On this 20 day of July, 1891, at  
Baltimore, County of City  
 State of Md., before me, J. E. S. Long, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared John  
Boster, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid  
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 51 years of age

Residence 1729, Parikh Alley, this city  
Laborer.

I enlisted in Co. C. 30. U. S. C. T. I. about  
 July 11, 1864, and served in said com-  
 pany as Corporal, and as Color bearer  
 for the rest, until about Christmas  
 1865.

Knew deceased soldier from boyhood to  
 death. He was a sound man when  
 he enlisted according to my opinion  
 deceased soldier was an attendant  
 in the hospital in service, up to  
 July 30 1864, at which time I was  
 wounded, and sent to Phila. Pa. at  
 Camp Saterle Summit House where  
 I remained until Dec 1864, rejoining  
 my command just in time to go  
 into the Ft Fisher Attack Dec 25, 64  
 Next saw soldier in 1865 at Roanoke  
 Island, N.C. and saw him daily  
 in service to muster out.

Knew that soldier prior July 30, 1864  
 told me he was a sufferer with diarrhea  
 and that when we were on Roanoke  
 Island, and after that to discharge  
 he also used to tell me he still suffered  
 with diarrhea, and I know from
