

DEPOSITION BCase of Sophia Queen, No. 417141

On this 19 day of January, 1892, at
Balto- County of City
 State of md, before me, Y. B. Harriet, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared George
Bennett, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 55 years of age, I do
 day labor reside and my P.O. address is #214
Chestnut st. This City.

I know the clmt, and was well
 acquainted with her husband Isaac Queen. met
 him first before the war, and served in the same
 Co. and regt. with him during service.

I was ~~for~~ sergt Co A 30. U.S.C. from
 winter of 1863 till winter of 1865.

Soldier was of good health when I first
 met him in service, and so continued till
 fall or sometime in 1864 while near Petersburg
 Va. he was then sick I cant say as to his
 exact complaint, other than he had a
 cough, and was away from Co. I cant
 say where he was I thought he was
 dead, till after the war I met him here
 in Balto. he was then in poor health
 suffering from cough and pains of breast
 and was so suffering when I last saw
 him. I cant say when that was - I
 heard soldier was dead cant
 say when he died or cause of death
 I cant say whether clmt has remarried
 or not.

Yes I am positive that Soldier suffered
 from a severe cough in service & was
 suffering from same when last seen by me
