

DEPOSITION KCase of Sophia Queen, No. 417,141

On this 15 day of July, 1891, at
Baltimore, County of City
 State of MD, before me, J. E. S. Conroy, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared William
Queen, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 63 years of age

Residence 1066 Raborg St this city.

Employed on the Wharf by the Emickson
 Line of Steamers. Worked there before
 the war, and have worked there con-
 tinuously for the past 20 years.

Isaac Queen was my brother.

Saw soldier when he was here on a
 for length he was well then.

Saw him immediately on his arrival here
 discharged from the army he then had
 rheumatism, and at times a severe
 pain in his left side, and breast, and
 these troubles lasted him till he died.

He had some cough with these
 troubles too.

"My idea is he died from these pains"
 "The Dr. Neff who attended for him
 can tell you"

"While living after discharge he appeared to
 have a 'miser' all through his life"

"These pains in the side would come
 only at times, when they come they
 would knock him off his feet entirely
 He was sick the whole winter before
 he died, but was confined to his bed
 but a short time before he died.

Never heard that he died of consumption
