

DEPOSITION MCase of Sophia Queen, No. 417,141On this 16 day of July, 1891, at
Baltimore, County of CityState of MD, before me, J. E. D. Casey, a
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Robert
Bailey, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
pension claim, deposes and says: I am 66 years of age

Residence 231 W. York St. this City
 Cooper on the Ericsson Steamers Wharf
 knew deceased soldier from the time he
 was 14 years old till he died. we both as
 boys began working together at that time
 for the same concern I am now
 working for and we worked for them
 until we enlisted. he went into
 the 30 U.S.C., T.D. and I into Co. D.
 39 U.S.C., T.D. I enlisted in June 1864
 and was discharged in the latter part
 of 1866. when I went to work again
 for the same Steamboat Co. and I
 have continued in their service to this
 day. My recollection is that
 Soldier was at work for said Co.
 when I went to work for them in
 the early part of 1867. and that
 he worked for them until he went
 to die.

I remember that Soldier from the
 time I first met him early in 1867
 till he died complaining of pain
 in his left side and I do know
 that he had a little backing cough
 all the time, and that he would use
 quinine or life time on that account
