Neff, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 53 years of age

My books of accounts show that I
 first attended claimant's family in
 Sept. 1865. and at intervals from
 that time to March 27. and 28th

1883. They also show visits in July
 1868. & a charge of \$2. and visits

Jan'y 29. & Feb'y 4. 1871. but they do
 not show who was sick, or the cause
 for which I was called.

Remember deceased soldier distinctly
 but I cannot today recall the disease
 with which he suffered, and for
 which I probably treated him.

My impression however is that
 he was suffering with pulmonary
 trouble. This is all I now recall
 as to his case.
