of his Regiment, showing the time when, place where
and circumstances under which he received the wound
under which he claims pension, but, by reason of the
muster out of the Regiment, and dispersal of the Officers
to parts unknown, he is unable to obtain such certificate,
and the best evidence he is able to furnish is the sworn
testimony of two enlisted men of the Regiment who
were present at the time he was wounded, and have full
knowledge of all the facts.
