A. D. 1867 before me the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace of the said State, in and for the City aforesaid, personally appeared Benjamin Paddock

Late Private Co. I. 35<sup>th</sup> Regt. U.S. Grps

and made oath on the Holy Evangely of Almighty God, that

I was wounded at Melrose Fair Road on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of September 1862 in the right arm below the elbow by a musket ball, which scattered the Bone, in such a manner as to render the arm useless. Was then taken to field Hospital, under treatment of Surgeon Jackson; was thence removed to camp Hospital, under treatment Surgeon Hammond, Somers Hospital (Ward, D,) Surgeon Sill, and thence to Fort Mifflin Hospital under treatment Surgeon Schammon, (Ward, A) and thence to my regiment on or about the middle of November 1862. Not knowing the whereabouts of any of the above named gentlemen it is impossible for me to furnish the certificate required
