January A.D. 1868 personally
appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the
City and State aforesaid James H. Powers late of Co
"D" 30th Regt U.S. a resident of Baltimore Md. whom I
certify to be respectable and entitled to credit as a witness, and
who being by me duly sworn according to law, on his oath says
that he was and is well acquainted with Benjamin Reddick
who was a Private Co "D" aforesaid Regiment in the service of the
United States and was detailed as sergeant at 5 o'clock
A.M. ; that he was present at Camp Meigs Baltimore
on or about the 20th day of July 1863 when said Benjamin
Reddick was mustered into aforesaid service by Co. Bowman
Mustering Officer at that Camp, and that said Reddick was
assigned to Company "D" aforesaid Regiment, but, shortly
after the Regiment arrived in the field, he was detailed at
Genl. Bates' Headquarters where he remained until he
was mustered out or discharged from the service.

And he further on oath says that the said Reddick was wounded
by gunshot through the right forearm in battle at or near
the National R.R. W.C. on the 28th day of September 1864 while
in the service aforesaid and in the line of his duty, and that in
that he has no interest direct or indirect in the claim of the
said Benjamin Reddick for a Pension his
