personally appeared before me a Justice
of the Peace in and for the City and State aforesaid Wm. H.
Black & Late Qu't Master Sgt. 30th Regt. U.S.C.T. a resident
of Baltimore, Md., and who, being by me duly sworn accord-
ing to law, on his oath says that he was and is well acquainted with
Benjamin Reddick who was a Private of Company "I" 30th Regt.
U.S.C.T. in the service of the United States, and was detailed as a
Sergeant at Brigade Head Quarters; that he was present at
Camp Siguer Baltimore on or about the - day of July 1863
and saw said Reddick mustered into aforesaid service by
Col. Poorman, Mustering Officer at said Camp, and that
said Reddick was assigned to Co. "G" of aforesaid Regiment, but,
shortly after the Regiment arrived in the field, he was detailed
as Sergeant at Brigade H^d Qrs (Genl. Bates) where he remained
until he was discharged from the service.

And deponent further says, on oath, that the aforesaid Benjamin
Reddick was wounded by Gunshot through the right
forearm in battle at or near the Weldon R.R. N.C. on the
25th day of September 1864, while in the service aforesaid
and in the line of his duty, and further that he has no interest
direct or indirect in the claim of said Benjamin Reddick
for a Pension
