sick at Gen. Hospital since June 20/64." On all subsequent rolls to Aug. 31, 1865  
"Present for duty." On roll for Sept. & Oct. 1865 "Discharged on acct of physical  
disability - w. Surg. Cert. Sept. 14, 1865." (2<sup>d</sup> M. Sgt.)
