
SIR:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of Oct. 10th, 1878, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for Pension No. 254,940 and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this Office:

It appears from the Rolls of U. S. Colored Troops on file in this Office that James Boomer was enrolled on the 24th day of March 1864, at Calvert, Md., in Co. "C", 39th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 24th day of March, 1864, at Baltimore, Md., in Co. "C", 39th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "C", of that Regiment, ~~for the months of~~ from Origin to April 30, 1864, he is reported absent, "At Baltimore, Md. since April 19th '64 awaiting transfer to U. S. Navy"; from April 30th to Oct. 31st, "Absent on detached service at Baltimore, Md. since April 18th '64"; from Oct. 31st '64 to Feby 28th '65, absent, "Sick at McKim's Mansion Hospital, Baltimore, Md. since Aug. 1st '64"; from Feby 28th to Oct. 31st, present for duty, with removal, "Returned to Co. from Hospital April 11th '65". He was mustered out of service with Co. Dec. 4th, 1865, at Wilmington, D. C. No evidence that he was wounded as alleged on Co. or Regt. Records on file in this Office. Supposed to be the soldier inquired for, as the name James Boomer is not found on the Muster Rolls of Co. "C", 39th U. S. C. T., on file in this Office.
