in hospital about three months, after he was first wounded
the wound was healed over when he came home
and bears the marks of two scars, one where the
bullet entered on the inside of the upper thigh
of the right thigh & the other where it passed out on the
outside a little obliquely downwards,
He complains of that leg being much weaker than the
other, especially after walking much & in cloudy weather
& thinks in all probability the disability will increase as he
gets older,
