At that time he was suffering from the effects of sunstroke which he received in the army, - his head was affected with aching, a sort of dizziness and he also had diarrhoea & piles. His passages were very painful & he ~~ext~~ complained of severe pain across his loins. From that time to the present I have remained upon most intimate terms with him living in same neighborhood & working with him whenever he has been able to work & I know that he has not done manual work <sup>1/2</sup> time
