

of good reputation ^{and} I am willing to accept
his identity of the soldier, as also that of
Egt James H. Freeman, who is also dead.

He was never known as James Rundles,
but the attorney having misspelled the name
deemed it prudent to file testimony of the
alias to correct his own error. The clmt.
submitted to me a receipt of Jas. E. Priscoe
& Co. (former Bounty Citys in this City) for the
soldier's discharge certificate, which I have no
doubt is now on file in 2nd Auditor's Office.

I have examined the Marriage records of the
Count as far back as 1839 but found no
record of marriage between soldier and Clmt.

I have, however, established the fact that
Soldier and Clmt. lived together and were regarded
as man and wife from and subsequent to the
war and up to his death, which, under Sec
4705 R. S. is sufficient evidence of marriage.

The Board of Health records of births,
commencing Jan'y 1, 1875, do not show birth
of Clmt's daughter claimed for. I have
