I do not know that Miss Bennie was sworn for me. The first day I was there Miss Bennie and her brother (O. H. Beale) were the only persons there. They witnessed my mark and set for Squire Tubman who came on on me. The next day I had another paper to sign and swear to. The two papers looked alike to me only the paper I signed the first day was longer than the one I signed the next day. My two witnesses, Miss Lowday and Mrs. Carney, were never there with me but one time. That was on Tuesday as stated. I do not know the day of the month. Now, I have never been there to L. H. G. office since the day I was there with the two women. I never swore to and signed any papers after that time. The day I was there with Miss Lowday and Mrs. Carney, Miss Bennie told me I need not come again until sent for. I now remember that I did go back there the same week with a letter from Preacher Beck that he could not find a church record of my daughter's birth. Now, I signed no papers that day and never swore to any papers before Squire Tubman, after the time I was with them with the two women. Mr. L. H. G. said he would abandon the claim for my child if I could not prove its birth, but I was never sworn to the paper you now read to me (affidavit Aug 28/93) because I was not one as to.
