Oswering me ^{and my witnesses}, I have never paid Mr Lloyd any money. I made no agreement with Mr Lloyd as to fees and nothing was said to me by any one in Lloyd's office about fees. I do not know how much Mr Lloyd would be entitled to if he got any fees for me. I think Miss Bessie and her brother (Oswede) signed the paper I did the first day I was there to apply for permission. I remember that Equine Tubman showed me to that paper in Lloyd's office. I do not know that he showed Miss Bessie and her brother that day or not. I do not remember seeing them since. I knew Miss Bessie two or three years before that by going there with my husband. Miss Bessie knew I was the wife of Jim Ernolds and so did her brother. Because they remembered me going there with my husband to see about his claim. I never saw them anywhere but in the office. I do not know her full name, nor do I know her brother's name. I think they call him "Mr Freddy". I am not sure however. I remember the first day I went to apply for permission I went over to the City Hall with some paper from Lloyd's and they told me to go back and tell Mr Lloyd to come over himself.
