On this day and date below written, personally appeared the affiant whose signature is hereto affixed and who being duly sworn according to law testified as follows :

"My name is *John H. Baynard*, I am *57* years old, and I reside in *Baltimore, Md.*, at No. *807 Sterling* Street.

I served in *Co A 19 U. S. A.* with the claimant *Enoch Waters*. I know that down in *Texas* in *1865* he was all crippled up with rheumatism and that he sprained himself causing a rupture. We were marching from *Pragos Island* to *Brownsville Texas* in *summer 1865* when he complained to me that he had sprained himself & shortly after this rupture developed. I did not see the rupture but I observed his suffering from it heard him say that his rupture was hurting him & know that he did light duty, and I have seen him several times while we were down in *Texas* put his hand on his groin and describe how it was paining him.

This was all written in my presence & only from my own oral statements to *A. P. Lloyd* at his office this *28 Dec 1896* without aid or prompting by any writing printing or recital.

I have no interest in this claim."

INSTRUCTIONS—Read Carefully.—Under the order of the Commissioner of Pensions number 229 in the preparation of testimony in support of claim in pension cases, all statements affecting the particular case and not merely formal, must be written or prepared to be type-written in the presence of the witness, and from his oral declarations then made to the person who then reduces the testimony to writing or then prepares the same to be type-written. And such testimony must embody a statement by the witness that such testimony was all written or prepared for type-writing (as the case may be) in his presence, and only from his oral statements then made; stating also the time, place, and person, when, where and to whom he made such oral statements, and that in making the same he did not use, and was not aided or prompted by any written or printed statement or recital, prepared or dictated by any other person; and not attached as an exhibit to his testimony.
