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I never heard of it. From the date of our marriage up to the time of his death we lived together as husband and wife. We never had any children. My recollection is that my husband died August 4<sup>th</sup> 1870 but my memory is poor and I have no record of it. Mr. Samuel H. Chase, who buried my husband, should be able to give the exact date of my husband's death.

Q. What was the deceased soldier's physical condition at the time of his discharge and continuously thereafter up to the date of his death?

A. When he came out of the army he stopped at my brother Thomas Mitchell, now deceased, at that time living on Hughes St. Balto. Md. The deceased soldier had a right bad cough at that time. I met him often from the time of his discharge up to the time of our marriage and he had this cough from discharge up to the time of our marriage and continuously thereafter up to the time of his death. He always had the appearance of a consumptive man after discharge, but he was of a very lively cheerful disposition and not given to complaining. He was confined to his house about 5 months prior to his death. He never had any physician but Dr. John F. Brown who has testified on my behalf. He had a cough from discharge to his death.

Q. For whom did the deceased soldier work subsequent to discharge?

A. He undertook to work in a lumber yard soon after our marriage but had to give it up on account of his weak lungs. After that he just fiddled and did chores around I am unable to state for whom he worked prior to our marriage. He never appeared to be able to do hard work of any kind after his discharge.

Q. Can you state the present whereabouts of any of the commissioned officers of said Company?

A. No sir. Dr. Augusta, the Surgeon of the Regt. resides in Washington D.C. He stated I sent a Mr. Stanley to see him but I don't remember what he, Dr. Augusta, testified to if he made any statement at all.

Q. What persons do you desire to have examined?
