

## DEPOSITION B

Case of Emeline Jolley widow, No. 227,082

On this twenty fifth day of November, 1884, at  
Baltimore, County of Baltimore  
 State of Maryland, before me, J. H. Simpson, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared  
Mrs Maria Pratt, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of afore-  
 said pension claim, deposes and says: that her age is 62 years;  
 that she is by occupation a washer and ironer;  
 that her post office address and place residence  
 is No 211 S. Howard Street, Baltimore, Md, and  
 that she was acquainted with the deceased  
 soldier John Jolley late Private Co. "D," 7<sup>th</sup> Regt,  
 U. S. A. I. from about the time of his marriage to the  
 claimant Emeline Jolley up to the time of his death.

Q. When and where was the claimant married to the  
 deceased soldier?

A. I was present when they were married at No 218  
Harbor St., Baltimore, Md, by the Rev Anthony  
Stanford but I am unable to state in what month  
 or year they were married.

Q. Can you state when the soldier died?

A. I can not.

Q. What was his physical condition at the time of his  
 marriage?

A. So far as I knew him he might have been impaired  
health but I knew but little about him and did not  
 visit him often after his marriage. I was not present  
 more than twice during his last illness, I always  
 understood that he died of consumption but I am  
 unable to state how long his lungs were affected before  
 he died. I am unable to state by what physicians  
 he was treated.

Q. Did the deceased soldier do much work subsequent  
 to his marriage?
