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A That I am unable to state as I did not live close to them, and but seldom met them.

Q. Was he affected by any other disease or disability than consumption while you knew him?

A. Not that I know of.

Q. Did you know the claimant prior to her marriage to the deceased soldier?

A. Oh yes sir from her girlhood.

Q. Was she ever married prior to her marriage to the deceased soldier?

A. No sir.

Q. Has she re-married since the death of the soldier?

A. No sir.

Q. Did she have any children by the deceased soldier?

A. No sir.

Q. Are you related to the claimant or otherwise interested in said claim?

A. I am not interested in the claim, but am distantly related to her. Her mother and mine were cousins.

Q. Have you testified relative to said claim prior to this?

A. Yes sir, with Jane Chan, I don't remember who else was present. I can't write my name.

Q. Referring to that affidavit you state therein that the claimant was married to deceased soldier in October 1868, today you are unable to state the month or year in which they were married how did you fix the <sup>time</sup> date of their marriage in former statement?

A. I might have remembered the year at that time and it is probable that my mind was refreshed at the time I made that affidavit. Since you mention it I believe that they were married in Oct. 1868.
