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the army. He was just in that condition up to the time of his death; gradually growing worse until he was confined to his house with the same complaint - disease of lungs. I never saw him after he was confined to his house. While he was able to go about I always shaved him.

Q. For whom did he work subsequent to discharge?

A. I am unable to state who he worked for, and as to the nature of his work, I think his work was jobs and chores. He was never able to do any hard work after he returned from the army. He appeared to be completely broken down, emaciated and thin and feeble in appearance.

Q. By what physicians was he treated?

A. I am unable to state by whom he was treated.

Q. Was he affected by any disease or disability other than disease of lungs or throat subsequent to discharge?

A. Not that I know of. I never heard of his having any other disease or disability.

Q. Are you related to claimant Emeline Jolly or otherwise interested in said claim?

A. Not a bit sir. I hardly know Mrs Jolly.

Q. Can you state when the claimant was married to the deceased soldier?

A. No sir. I never visited the deceased soldier or the claimant.

Q. Has your memory relative to the deceased soldier been refreshed by conversation or otherwise lately?

A. No sir.
