

## DEPOSITION E.

Case of Emeline Jolley widow, No. 227,082

On this twenty fifth day of November, 1884, at  
Baltimore, County of Baltimore

State of Maryland, before me, J. H. Simpson, a  
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

James H. Larkin, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-  
said pension claim, deposes and says: that his age is 40 years; that  
he is by occupation a barber; that his place of  
business is No 46 Saratoga Street and his place  
of residence is No 28 Bolton Street, Baltimore, Md.  
Q. that he was Commissary, Sergt. 7<sup>th</sup> Regt. U. S. C. I,  
from Sept. 1863 up to October 1866, and that he was  
well acquainted with John Jolly deceased, late Private  
Co. "B." of said Regt. during the period of his, the deceased  
soldier's service, the former being Com. Sergt. of said Regt.

Q. What was the deceased soldier's physical condition  
during the period of his service?

A. As I remember him at first he was a hearty  
robust man up to the time he was wounded Sept.  
29<sup>th</sup> 1864 at Chancellors Farm, Va. I am unable to state the  
nature or location of his wound but I well remember  
the circumstances of his being wounded, I did not see  
him any more until he returned his company at Indianola  
Texas, sometime in the latter part of the year 1865.

Q. What was his condition when he rejoined his command in  
1865?

A. He appeared to be broken down like a man subject  
to fever, and consumptive, and had a hacking  
cough. He was with us about a year up to the time  
of our muster out of service and he did not appear  
to derive better health at time of his discharge.  
He was on light duty around the Commissary Department  
off and on up to the time of his discharge and I was  
with him quite frequently up to time of discharge.
