in explanation of the discrepancy alleged
to have occurred in affidavits made in the
case of Emeline Jolly he offers the following:
1st At the time of making his first affidavit
his memory was refreshed by certain records
and comparisons with contemporaneous events
he fixed the date of John Jolly's ^{death} as August 1871
while the second affidavit was made merely
from memory though he ^{is} under the impres-
sion that he stated then as before that the
said John Jolly died in August 1870 & that
it was ^{probably} owing to a clerical error that Aug.
4 1870 was stated. From a careful recalling
of the facts in the case & from comparing it
with contemporaneous events he reiterates his
first statement that John Jolly died in August
1871

And he has no interest in the claim of Emeline Jolly for Reversion
