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all the time. He was what we called a "dead beat on sick cell." He was frequently in my tent. We went to Hilton Head S.C. in March 1864 thence to Jacksonville Fla. thence back to vicinity of Hilton Head. We came to Petersburg Va. in the latter part of July 1864. Jolly was in poor health all this time, & frequently detailed him as an orderly on account of his poor health. Some time that summer or fall of 1864 - he was detailed as a cook in his company.

Q. How did he appear to be affected during that summer?

A. He had a hacking cough and complained of pain in his ~~best~~ breast, & was some what troubled with the same complaint at that time, and I remember his saying that we would never get over it.

Q. When did you first observe this cough and his first complaints about his breast?

A. I think I first observed it while we were at Camp Benedict, Md. probably a month or so before we left that place.

Q. Are you positive he had this cough at that time?

A. Yes sir. upon reflection I am. A great many of our men contracted a diarrhoea at Benedict and it was generally accompanied by a cough, & I remember that Jolly had a hacking cough at Benedict and he still had it during the next summer, & I remember that he went to hospital from somewhere about Petersburg, Va. but I am unable to state when or from where he was sent to hospital or for what he was sent to hospital, & I remember when he rejoined us in Texas some time in 1865 but I am unable to give the date or month, when he rejoined us in Texas he was about the same as he was when about Petersburg Va. had a hacking cough and was in poor ~~ough~~ health, & then detailed him as an orderly at Regt. Head Quarters, & don't think he was orderly long.

Q. Was he affected by any other disease or disability
