A. If he was I don't remember it.

Q. When I mention it can you recall to mind whether he was wounded at Fort Belvoir Va. Sept 29/64 or at any other place or time while in the service?

A. Since you mention it very impressive is that he was wounded at Fort Belvoir, Va. but I could not swear to it.

Q. When did you see ^{him} subsequent to that engagement?

A. I am unable to state I might have seen him at that time or soon afterwards but I can't call him to mind until sometime after we got to Texas.

Q. Can you state whether he was sent to L

Q. Have you testified relative to said claim prior to this?

A. Yes sir I went up to Belthorn, Md. to make that affidavit.

Q. Is that your signature?

A. Yes sir.

Q. Referring to that affidavit you state therein that that the deceased soldier "was taken sick near Petersburg Va. that he was relieved and detailed as Cook; that he became worse + was sent to hospital near Feters Mountain Va. today you state that you are unable to state for what he was sent to hospital. please explain this.

A. At the time that affidavit was made out I objected to that but the lawyer said that that point was not important, and so I let it go.

Q. Was the deceased soldier affected by venereal disease or any disease other than diarrhoea or disease of lungs while in the service?

A. No. He was a very moral and steady man while I knew ^{him}. He was in very poor health during the time of his discharge and spit up a great deal with his cough. I am not positive what he I saw him after his discharge or not. ^{Deponent.} Daniel Garry
