What were his symptoms?

I can hardly tell. He was in a kind of stupid state and was up and down - not in bed all the time. No, I did not hear him complain of his side at the time of his last sickness, but I had heard him speak of his side before he took sick - while I was working with him, but I do not know what the matter was. I could not tell the names of the Committee from the lodge who attended him. I was called in myself to help shroud him.

No, I do not know that he took cold prior to his last attack of sickness. No he had no lung trouble to my knowledge. No, I cannot remember that he ever had any cough.

I did not see him very often during his last sickness. I called occasionally to enquire about him, but did not see so much of him, and cannot tell about his symptoms. He was married while in the Refinery. I did not know ^{his wife} prior to the marriage, but have known her since. No she has not remarried or cohabited with any man as his wife since the death of her husband that I ever heard of. She is a very good woman. When I left the Refinery ~~and~~ left Holy Boston there and he staid there until the concern failed. When I got back from my sea voyage I found him sick, and he soon after died. I do not know which side he complained of.
