

I cannot recall now just how his health was at discharge and while I remained at Annapolis. I do not know of what disease he died. I met him occasionally in Baltimore, but cannot say how his health was while there. I attended his wedding - I remember that he appeared to be in good health at that time.

I noticed when I met him after the war that he had a little cough, but nothing to amount to anything - it did not appear to affect his health. I heard that he worked in the sugar refinery in Baltimore, though I did not see him there - I knew he was at work.

I never heard that she remarried after his death. I have always known her and her family. She takes after her mother, and appears to be a Christian woman - is a strict member of the church. I think she is strictly a virtuous woman. I know that the white people of this town looked upon her mother as a woman of high character.

I do not know where James Williams is.
