

It has been so long that I have forgotten the names of those who were in the service with my husband, but I believe Joseph Addison, George Thomas and Wallace Stewart, all of Annapolis, were in the service with him. I do not know who his bunk mate was.

Prior to his enlistment he had been a farm laborer; after his discharge, he was a laborer - worked at anything he could get to do.

He did not remain long at Annapolis after his discharge - he came up here to Baltimore and worked in the Sugar Refinery for ~~Hiltzmann~~ - they are broken up long ago, and I do not know that any of them are in town.

I have heard you read the names on the list of Comrades, but I do not know any of them.

He continued to work in the Sugar Refinery until I married him in 1864, and worked on there until the concern failed.

Charles Hammett, Zachariah Scott and Frederick Thomas worked with him in the Refinery. After he began
