Boston, but I never knew her husband *Wm Boston*.
 He died before I knew her, but I have known her ever
 since about the time of his death. She lived in the
 same house with me several years. She had four
 children but two of them died in this house when
 she was living with me. At that time she was washing
 for a living. No she never had any man come to
 see her - she appeared to be a very nice woman -
 I never heard that she ever lived with any man as
 his wife or otherwise after her husband's death.
 She has never remarried that I ever heard of. I
 have not seen her since last fall - she was not then
 married.
