I hereby Certify, That I have carefully examined,
 Benjamin Malone, late a Private of Co. G.
 19th U.S.C. Troops

in the service of the United States, who was discharged
 at Alexandria, on the — day of —
 1865, and is an applicant for an invalid pension, by reason of
 alleged disability resulting from gun shot wounds.

Degree of
disability.

In my opinion the said Benjamin Malone
 is one half incapacitated for obtaining his subsistence by
 manual labor from the cause above stated.

Origin.

Judging from his present condition, and from the evidence
 before me, it is my belief that the said disability occurred
 in the service aforesaid in the line of duty.

Probable
duration.

The disability is permanent.

A more particular description of the applicant's condition
 is subjoined.

Particular
description.

Gun shot wound of left wrist - fracturing ulna -
 inability to flex the thumb, first & second fingers.
 Wound of abdomen - flesh wound of wall -
 no disability from it.
