

Division report of casualties in the regiment shows him - Wounded at Cemetery Hill, Va., July 30, 1864.

Company Morning Reports covering Jan'y, 64, to Sept. 65, show him July 30, 64, Wounded; Aug. 1, 64, Wounded & in Hosp.; Aug. 8, 64, Sent to Gen'l. Hosp.; Nature, or location of Wound not shown.

Company Returns covering March, April, Sept., Nov. & Dec., 1864, & to Sept., 1865, show him, Aug. & Sept., 65, Absent sick at Dummick House Hosp., Philadelphia.

Records on file furnish no additional information as to Wound, or disability during his service, save as shown by Surgeon's Certificate of disability for discharge.

Regimental Register of Men in Hospital does not bear his name.

Regimental Hospital records are not on file.
