

A. Declaration for Invalid Pension.

On this 15 day of Sept 1865, personally appeared before me, a Deputy Clerk of a Court of Record, in the County and District aforesaid, Benj. Malone aged 42 years, a resident of Baltimore County of Baltimore in the State of Md. who, being duly sworn, declares that he is the identical Benj. Malone who enlisted in the service of the United States at Baltimore in the State of Md. on the 3 day of June 1864, as a Private in Company E commanded by John H. Richard Private in the 19 Regiment of U.S. Col. Troops in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the 23 day of Sept 1865. That while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, on or about the 23 day of July in the year of our Lord 1864, he was wounded in battle in front of Petersburg Va by Minnie ball through left arm and at same time was wounded by a musket ball through left side arm and hand weak unable to perform much manual labor in the field. He was treated and discharged from Lawrence Hospital Alexandria Va.

He makes this application for a pension, provided by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862, and hereby appoints DARIUS FORBES, General Claim Agent of the United States Sanitary Commission, or his successor in office, of Washington, D. C., his lawful attorney, and authorizes him to present and prosecute this claim, and to receive and receipt for any orders or certificates that may be issued in satisfaction thereof.
