There was 3 declarations filed by Lloyd in this claim, one dated July 21-90 is a Rice declaration and bears all the marks of irregularities so well known to the Bureau in that lot of claims filed by Lloyd. The Clerk appears to have no knowledge as to persons named as witnesses or the officer who executed that declaration. The 2nd declaration dated Oct 15 1891 he has some recollection of & probably it ~~is~~ was properly executed, but I do not think Ingers & Beale had at that time sufficient knowledge of this Clerk
