 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 60 years of age.
 in fact I don't know my age. I
 reside and my City address is 1123
 Clarksons Alley Baltimore Md.
 I was pris, B. 19, U.S.C.T. for 3
 years I can't give dates of discharge
 or enlistment, think I went in 1863
 & came out in 1866.

I have known this Clerk Robert
 Barnes since I enlisted into the
 above service, he was in my
 regt but not my Co. I think
 he was in Co. D. I am not positive
 as to his Co. but sure he was in
 my regt. he was with the regt
 when I joined it & was discharged
 when I was. I know of no
 disease, wound or injury had
 by him in service, since the war
 he has complained of pains of
 his body & piles -
