I do day labor reside and my

I have known this pensioner
Robert Barnes for the last 6 or 7
years. he does light jobs at day
labor, and I have worked with him
for a few days at the time, on 2 or 3
different occasions think its been 6
years ago since I worked with him,
we cleaned mortar off of old bricks at the
times I worked with him, I have not
heard more than 7 squares from him
since I knew him, I have seen him at least
once each month during my acquaintance
with him. For the last 6 years Barnes
has complained to me of rheumatism, his
feet & legs seems to be bothered with
rheumatism, he often uses a cane, I cant
say as to him being confined to his house,
with any ailment, or as to medical
aid, nor as to his inability to do
work, only know that I have
considered that he had rheumatism
for the last 6 years, he appears
to me as not able to do full work
by reason of rheumatism
