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I know of no other ailment of his. I can't remember of him ever complaining to me of piles or heart disease, and I have no personal knowledge as to same, yes sir. I have signed papers for Barnes in his pension matter on 2 different occasions; it was ~~on~~ different times during the first months of this year that I signed papers for him. Mary Maker Barnes & my self signed the first paper & were sworn together on the bible by a squire whose office is a few doors on St. Paul st below Lloyds. Can't say who else was present when we signed or were sworn. Can't describe any one there, or say as to the number of persons in the room. Mary Maker & I signed the 2nd paper & were sworn together the same squire swore us on both occasions, Can't say who was present on either occasion, except Lloyd, Maker, Barnes & my self. Barnes was not sworn the 2nd time with us. I swore both times that I knew Barnes & that he was disabled from work on account of rheumatism. I never knew of his piles & heart disease that's a mistake. Barnes is of good habits
