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he was totally disabled from work I dont think he done any work in 1893, and he has at all times attributed his rheumatism as the cause of his inability to work. his rheumatism seems to affect his entire body. it is of a painful nature, that is his complaints to me when asking, ~~was sworn~~ pains of body. Yes sir, I signed & was sworn at one time to a paper for this pensioner. Jacob Dixon signed & was sworn to the same paper. so did Barnes. I never signed but the one paper. I cant say when it was, it was at Mr Lloyds office that we 3 signed the paper & we (Barnes, Dixon, and myself) went to a squires office below Lloyds, same street & were there sworn. Yes, the 3 of us were sworn together on the bible by the squire I never knew his name. I think Mr Lloyd wrote the paper we signed. I cant say who was present when we 3 signed the paper. No I dont think the squire was present when we signed the paper, but he did ask us before he swore us if we had signed the paper & I said yes. I cant remember of him asking any other questions, dont know who were present when we were sworn. I am unable to say who was at Lloyds or the squires office that day except Lloyd, Dixon, Barnes & myself. Yes I think there were others about
